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# **NSNA Leadership University Honor Society**



This is an exciting time to join or renew your membership in NSNA. All NSNA members are invited to launch their Professional Identity Formation in Nursing through participation in the inaugural NSNA Leadership University Honor Society. Enroll in the Honor Society by participating in leadership at the school, state, or national level. By serving in a leadership position (i.e., elected or appointed to the Board

of Directors, chapter committees, and participation in projects/activities as determined by your chapter), and attending state association and NSNA virtual and/or live meetings, you will qualify. Your chapter must have a minimum of 10 members and be eligible for official NSNA constituency status (renewed annually) for chapter leaders to enroll in the Honor Society. All NSNA members are eligible-there are no additional dues required.

## **Professional Identity Formation in Nursing**

The NSNA Leadership University Honor Society accelerates your formation of a Professional Identity in Nursing. Nursing school is the beginning of your leadership journey that will advance your career and contribute to the advancement of the nursing profession. ## Who Can Join?\*

National Student Nurses Association is a membership organization representing 60,000 students enrolled in state-approved Associate, Diploma, Baccalaureate, and Direct Entry Master's degree programs. RN in BSN completion programs are also eligible for membership. NSNA helps to prepare students for Registered Nurse licensure and to form their professional identity in nursing.
